5. Provide a framework for the penalties to be imposed for violations of Chapter 467 on persons involved in or associated with unarmed combat in this State.
6. Provide a framework for the investigatory powers of the Executive Director for violations of Chapter 467.
7. Revise the requirements concerning due dates for medicals, bout agreements, glove inspections and contracts relevant to licensees and other participants.
8. Revise the treatment of complimentary tickets for the purposes of computing gross receipts.

9. Revise the definition of “out of competition” to include stimulants listed under section S-6 of the WADA list of prohibited substances.
10. Update regulations to comply with Federal Law.
11. Update requirements for licensees.
12. Update existing regulations.
